



New Business Motions: Themes: Voting ability and Financials

- **Motion A:** That the following members of the South Florida Area I5 be able to place a motion before the Area for consideration. The members are by resolution: The Delegate, Alternate Delegate, all Area Officers, all District Chairpersons, all Chairpersons of Standing Committees of the South Florida Area, all District Committee Members, and all Alternate District Committee Members if their DCM is absent or they have no DCM in their subdistrict.
- Motion B: That Area 15 General Service Representatives (GSRs) (and in their absence, Area 15 alternate General Service Representatives (AGSRs)) be added as non-funded members of the Area 15 Committee with full motion making, seconding and amending abilities.
- Motion C: The Accessibilities Committee is requesting a ONETIME increase in the 2025 budget. We will have an expenditure of \$ 335.48. Our current balance is \$153.15. The amount for the increase will be \$ 182.33.
- Motion D: That the Prudent Reserve Fund be increased from \$15,000 to \$20,000. This amount shall be reviewed on an annual basis by the Acting Finance Committee during the budgetary process each year to maintain a Prudent Reserve Fund equal to 25% of our actual operating expenditures.
- **Motion E:** To update and replace motion 286 with the following: All requests for non-budgeted funds under \$500 are to be submitted to the Finance Committee for consideration and approval, and if approved, then submitted to the Area 15 Treasurer for payment. The Finance committee's consideration will include whether or not the area has funds to fulfill the request, and to confirm the expenditure is within the committee's (or officer's or delegate's) scope. The Finance committee is to perform this duty within 2 weeks of submission and report any of these actions at the following quarterly's Finance Committee report. Any requests for non-budgeted funds beyond \$500 should be submitted as motions to the Area 15 Chairperson under the Current Practice for motions.

JULY 2025 ASSEMBLY MOTION OUTCOME

MOTION A: NOT HEARD AS WOULD SET PRECEDENT OF MOTION BEING MADE BY ADCM. REPLACED WITH IMMEDIATE ATTENTION MOTION THAT FAILED IN NEEDING IMMEDIATE ATTENTION 144 TO 120

Motion A:

Area 15 adopt a one-year hotel bid process for the next Assembly bid cycle, replacing the current two-year cycle. This would apply to upcoming bid only. Allows time for discussion. Does the current format of Area Assemblies meet our needs and is it financially prudent? This motion suspends Motion 745 for duration of the upcoming bid cycle.

Background A:

Allow us to:

- Reassess if the current Assembly model is effective, inclusive and affordable.
- Explore options to widen participation reduce barriers to service.
- Guided by our group conscience.

Area 15 holds four Assemblies annually, three days each. Recent inventories and a survey identified members' concerns regarding cost, accessibility, and time commitment. Utilization of information gathered.

Costs for lodging, meals, transportation creates barriers to service despite being willing and weakens our diversity and strength.

Difficulty in finding suitable facilities results in rooms stretched beyond capacity, overcrowding and inaccessibility for members and emergency access. Submitted by Debbie H,ADCM, District 8, Subdistrict 7

MOTION B PRESENTED AS AMMENDED: MOTION FAILED 150-126 ON FIRST

VOTE. AFTER MINORITY OPTION, A MOTION TO RECONSIDER WAS MADE AND PASSED WITH SIMPLE MAJORITY 161-95. SECOND VOTE MOTION FAILED 126-126.

Motion B:

That the July 2026 Area 15 Assembly be held online using the Area 15 virtual account. This will be conducted as a test run to determine the feasibility of continuing the practice in future assemblies. At the conclusion of this test run an evaluation shall be conducted by an appointed Ad Hoc committee which will provide the evaluation report at the following October 2026 Assembly.

Background B:

Area 15 currently meets four times per year for three day assemblies in person. This comes at great expense to Area 15 and to Area 15 trusted servants, particularly GSR's. Holding two of the assemblies online would provide the opportunity for greater GSR participation throughout Area 15 for those who cannot attend in person, due to financial or other personal reasons. Area 15 would continue to hold April and October assemblies in person. This would allow all groups near or far, big or small within Area 15 the opportunity to have a voice at more assemblies. This would also support our southern districts such as District 14 (The Virgin Islands), District 16 (Bahamas) and District 19 (The Cayman Islands) This would also greatly reduce the amount of 7th tradition funds used to support Area 15 business meetings thus making available for our primary purpose.

Motion C:

I hereby make a motion to move the Area 15 Quarterly Business meeting from Sunday to Saturday.

Background C:

The Area 15 quarterly business meeting is currently held on the last day of the assembly weekend, Sunday morning at 9am. This can make it difficult to be well-rested and attentive, after a day and a half of scheduled assembly activities and two nights in a hotel. Most hotels require check out by I Iam, requiring attendees to check out before the start of the business meeting or in the middle of the business meeting, making it difficult to be present or participate fully. Motion E:

That Area 15 submit the following proposed agenda item for the 2026 General Service Conference on behalf of Area 15. Proposed agenda item:

To remove the last two pie chart graphics from the "Self Support: Where the Money and Spirituality Mix" pamphlet on page 13. This includes the second pie chart, which is divided into four sections and features the intergroup data, along with the third pie chart, which is divided into three sections and does not include the intergroup information. Please see the chart below.

Background E:

The pamphlet provides suggestions for how groups can allocate their contributions. While the pie chart offers examples, many groups are interpreting these suggestions too rigidly. This can lead to certain entities, which require more support, being overlooked. For example, the pie chart recommends allocating 50% of total contributions to an intergroup office while designating only 10% to the area and district. Moreover, these pie charts are obsolete – in fast fast-changing environment, groups need to be aware of the needs of all entities they would contribute to, and we should avoid a situation where "examples" are mistaken for suggestions which become mechanically repeated over time. With the rise of online literature sales, the intergroup offices no longer play as significant a role in the functioning of groups as they once did. Many AA entities have the potential to make more substantial contributions when groups direct their funds toward meaningful and essential work that benefits all groups within the district, area, and the entire AA community.



Samples of Group Contributions to A.A. Service Entities


